Family Support Work Update

As many of you know we have close and ongoing links to FSW (Family Support Work) who support some of the very needy families in Sussex. As you can imagine the need for support in the past months has increased, at the same time their ability to fundraise has decreased.

To let you know of some recent needs **locally** which really opened up my eyes to the impact FSW has:

Michelle (Rotherfield/Uckfield) says: I had two new referrals last month for families struggling with their mental health during Lockdown. I think they really appreciated having someone to talk to at the end of a phone to offload. I now have weekly phone calls booked in my diary, which is a rarity these days!

I have been working closely with [a local] school who have been concerned about a couple of families' overall wellbeing. Some children have started to self-harm. School have supported some vulnerable children throughout the lockdown by allowing them attend school P/T. And some parents are allowing their children back today satisfied that measures have been put in place.

Food continues to be a much-needed resource. My list of recipients has increased and they have been so grateful for the deliveries. It has been a huge help.

One parent has lost her job and is still waiting to receive Universal Credits. She is behind in her rent and her landlord is threatening to take her to court. Luckily, the law states they cannot be evicted during Lockdown.

Another parent is still working at a care home and trying to hold the family together. Her husband is registered disabled and they have two teenage children with Autism and ADHD. I have started to introduce 'social distance' meet ups in the park as some of the more vulnerable families I work with are desperate to see a familiar face. It is so rewarding seeing a smile on their face when we meet.
