## Christmas Concert Service 13<sup>th</sup> December 2020, 5pm Rectory Field

Join us for a musical Christmas service, we may not be able to sing but we will have a professional brass ensemble!

This will be **the closest thing to a traditional carol service** we will have this year and is open to both **Frant and Eridge** to join us for what should be an amazing evening.

If you can we ask for a donation towards the cost of the evening and the professional musicians of  $\pm 10$  for over 12s. Children free. This is optional and can be given when you book online. If you know people who can't book online, perhaps you could help them by booking online for them?

We will be **OUTSIDE** (dress warm!) in the Rectory field at 5pm (**bring a torch**) - you will need to **bring your own chair**. Walking shoes or wellies might be advisable too for uneven wet ground. The service will include traditional Christmas readings, music and a choir.

The rule of 6 applies, so you can sit in groups. However as before you need to not interact with others outside your group and maintain social distancing. Something we are all very used to by now.

There will be fairy lights, real fires and torchlight. The event will happen outside even if it rains so **bring a brolly!**

"Thank you so much for your prayers. I still have lots of non-epileptic attacks / seizures each day. Some are small, and some are horrible and violent, but I am trusting God for the future. Please keep praying for me.

I went to youth group and we were doing about when Jesus' disciples were fishing all night and didn't catch a thing. Then Jesus told them to throw their net on the other side of the boat and the net was overflowing. Then Jesus called them onto the shore and cooked them breakfast.

This had just been an incredibly tough time for the disciples. Jesus had just died and there were even rumours he had risen again, and it had completely changed their life. It all happened really fast and no-one understood, they were really struggling and weren't at all sure why any of this had happened or how to feel about it.

Then Jesus turns up and does a simple thing - cooks them breakfast. In the midst of all their deepest fears, problems, worries and feelings, Jesus gave them a small reminder of how much God loves them and how even in the darkest times he cares and always has a plan.

I've had a really tough few months, being in and out of hospital and having so many seizures, and I felt quite similar emotions to the disciples - my life has completely changed, except for one thing, God. He stays the same. And through these difficult times there have been certain Bible verses, lyrics from songs, quotes that have put a smile on my face and just like Jesus cooking the disciples breakfast that morning, reminded me that God is in control and this is all part of his AMAZING plan! I trust him! In all things God works for the good of those who love him."
